### ISLAY

<b>Laphroaig 10yo 40%</b>	<b>6.5</b>
Laphroaig 10 is really smoky & iodine rich. This has to be one of Scotland's most characterful drams. Laphroaig's are known for their medicinal malts & the 10 year old delivers that in abundance.	
<b>Bunnahabain Provenance 10yo 46%</b>	<b>7.95</b>
Salty, Earthy, tobacco yet sweet. Single cask, only 1 of 337 bottle sold in Edinburgh exclusively	
<b>Caol Ila Carn Mor 8yo 46%</b>	<b>7.5</b>
Sweet & mellow with peaty finish. Single cask only 1 of 415 bottles sold in Edinburgh exclusively	
<b>Talisker 10yo 45.8%</b>	<b>6.5</b>
It's a bonfire of peat crackling with black pepper, with a touch of brine and dry barley	

### HIGHLAND

<b>Clynelish 14yo 46%</b>	<b>5.95</b>
A coastal and peaty single malt, a fabulous flavour profile filled with its distinctive waxy notes	
<b>Dalwhinnie 15yo 43%</b>	<b>6.95</b>
Walnut steeped in Manuka honey with Vanilla sponge. Gentle smokiness, a touch of spice	
<b>The Glenmorangie 10yo 40%</b>	<b>5.95</b>
Fresh and balanced , Vanilla. Boiled sweets, very creamy, Tiramisù, Toffee	

### SPEYSIDE

<b>Spey Trutina 46%</b>	<b>6.5</b>
Sweet and Crisp, Nectarine Fruit and Chocolate. Small Batch	
<b>Spey Fumare 46%</b>	<b>6.5</b>
Sweet, Fruity, Smoky and Coastal. Small Batch	
<b>The Balvenie 12yo 46%</b>	<b>6.95</b>
Sweet with good body. The bourbon characters develop; gentle spice with a little vanilla, a hint of balancing peat lurking quietly in the substrata. Dried fruit too, combining with nuts, nutmeg, cinnamon, back into the bourbon notes, so well integrated	
<b>Glenfiddich 12yo 45.8%</b>	<b>5.95</b>
Light, floral, spices. Very smooth	

### LOWLAND

<b>Glenkinchie 12yo 43%</b>	<b>8.5</b>
Very fruity palate with a mix of stewed fruits, dessert wine, apple peels and honey. Becomes quite oaky late palate	
Just 15 miles from the Capital, Glenkinchie is the Edinburgh Malt
